Moderator Dani Fecko, president of arts management company Fascinator Management, will ensure a lively discussion exploring arts and culture's impact on the economy, education, health and wellbeing and society. The debate will also focus on funding for arts grants and arts infrastructure in Vancouver.

- 1. Economy: Investing in the creative economy is an investment in jobs. The province's main economic drivers are now based around innovation, creativity and the knowledge economy.
- 2. Education: Students with an education rich in the arts have better grade point averages and are three times more likely to get a degree.
- 3. Health and Wellbeing: Regardless of income level or education, participation in culture is strongly associated with good health and high life satisfaction.
- 4. Society: Experiencing creativity in any form that deals with poverty, sexuality, racism, and other issues helps us understand humanity and break down boundaries. Arts and culture help us develop tolerance and compassion.
